Funding to visit exemplary community health care programs in the United States that appear to meet the criteria for "community recovery." Studying the community of Geel (see below) has allowed me identify factors related to their long-term success and has led me to describe a concept of "community recovery." The recovery model of treatment focuses on establishing a meaningful role in life and in the community rather than relying on a belief that mental illness can be "cured." The community's role in this model suggests that they must also learn to *live with* the realities of mental illness.
